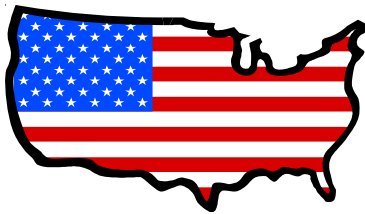

Sacramento Update: January/February 2017

The start of the 2017-18 Legislative Session reminds me once again of Mark Twain's quote of "No man's life, liberty, or property are safe while the legislature is in session." With one political party now controlling a "supermajority" of both the State Senate and Assembly, there are renewed proposals to raise taxes and impose more regulations. While some of these proposals have yet to be fully fleshed out, you can rest assured that I will do everything I can to fight for San Diego and Orange County taxpayers.

In addition, I will continue to champion measures to make our communities safer. For example, I have reintroduced legislation to imprison sex offenders who cut off their GPS tracking devices, which the governor vetoed in 2015.

The California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation reports that 1,246 people removed, disabled or tampered with their GPS devices in an 11-month period in 2015 and 2016. With the recent conviction of a person who murdered at least four women in Orange County, it is more important than ever that we appropriately punish offenders who cut off their GPS bracelets before they do something more heinous.

CFRW Capitol Update –January 31, 2017

Bills Abound

The legislature is back in full swing, with a flurry of bills being introduced every day. The deadline for lawmakers to introduce bills this session is February 17. That doesn't mean new bills can't be created later in the legislative session, after the deadline. It just means that legislators use constitutional loopholes like "spot bills" to fill in the language of the bill at a later date. Luckily, since Prop 54 passed last November, it is more difficult for legislators to use less than honest bill practices like "gut and amend." We will be talking more about these legislative terms as the session goes on.

Here are some bills that are on our radar, for better or worse:

AB 27 (Melendez, R): Fixes Prop 53 and Prop 36 by defining violent felonies to include rape, sodomy, penetration with a foreign object, or oral copulation, if the victim was unconscious, if the victim was incapable of giving consent due to intoxication, if the victim was incapable of giving legal consent because of a mental disorder or developmental or physical disability, if the victim submitted to the act under the belief that the person committing the act was someone known to the victim other than the accused, or if the act was accomplished against the victim's will by threatening to use the authority of a public official, thereby amending Proposition 36 by adding to the list of violent felonies that can be prosecuted as a 3rd strike.

AB 197 (Kiley, R): Again fixes Prop 53 and Prop 36 by defining violent felonies to include child abduction, providing a child under 16 years of age for purposes of a lewd act, abduction of a minor for purposes of prostitution, child abuse, sodomy with a minor, oral copulation of a minor, contact with a minor to commit specified offenses, arranging a meeting with a minor for lewd purposes, employing a minor to produce sexual matter, elder and dependent adult abuse, false imprisonment of an elder or dependent adult, and animal abuse, as specified, thereby amending Proposition 36 by adding to the list of violent felonies that can be prosecuted as a 3rd strike.

SB 18 (Pan, D): This bill would declare the intent of the Legislature to expand and codify the Bill of Rights for Children and Youth of California to establish a comprehensive framework that governs the rights of all children and youth in California, outlines the research-based essential needs of California's children, and establishes standards relating to the health, safety, well-being, early childhood and educational opportunities, and familial supports necessary for all children to succeed. The bill would declare the intent of the Legislature, by January 1, 2022, to enact legislation for the purpose of ensuring that the Bill of Rights for Children and Youth of California, in its totality, is applied evenly, equitably, and appropriately to all children and youth across the state.

SB 29 (Lara, D): This bill would, commencing on January 1, 2019, prohibit a city, county, or city and county, or a local law enforcement agency from entering into, renewing, or extending the length of a contract with a private corporation, contractor, or vendor to detain immigrants in civil immigration proceedings for profit.

SB 54 (DeLeon, D): Current law provides that when there is reason to believe that a person arrested for a violation of specified controlled substance provisions may not be a citizen of the United States, the arresting agency shall notify the appropriate agency of the United States having charge of deportation matters. This bill would repeal those provisions. Current law provides that whenever an individual who is a victim of or witness to a hate crime, or who otherwise can give evidence in a hate crime investigation, is not charged with or convicted of committing any crime under state law, a peace officer may not detain the individual exclusively for any actual or suspected immigration violation or report or turn the individual over to federal immigration authorities. This bill would, among other things, prohibit state and local law enforcement agencies and school police and security departments from using resources to investigate, interrogate, detain, detect, or arrest persons for immigration enforcement purposes.

ACA 3 (Kiley, R): This measure would transfer from the Attorney General to the Legislative Analyst the duty of preparing the title and summary for a proposed initiative or referendum.

More Gas Taxes

Board of Equalization member, Senator George Runner, will be our keynote banquet speaker this weekend at our Board of Directors' Meeting. He just released a short statement on the proposed gas tax hikes by Governor Brown, which all Californians should be made aware of. Increasing taxes is not the way to fix our crumbling transportation infrastructure. But even though Senator Runner and Republicans have proposed plenty of alternate solutions to the problem, Governor Brown and Legislative Democrats would rather raise taxes instead. Below is Senator Runner's piece.

"This month, I had the honor of attending the State of the State Address. During his speech, Governor Brown spoke of the need for bi-partisanship when it comes to solving our state's toughest problems. Unfortunately, he didn't stop there. Brown continued his calls for a 42 percent gas tax hike, plus an additional \$65 vehicle registration fee that includes hybrids and electric vehicles. He claims the increases are needed because repairing California's highways can't be funded with existing revenues. I disagree. I called on the governor to use existing revenues to repair our roads. Budgets are about priorities. If our leaders have failed to properly prioritize and manage our existing tax dollars, is it really wise to give the more?"
